PASTURAGE AND ENCLOSURE REGULATIONS REGULATION 5

I, Victoria Jack, Minister for Land and the Environment, direct the owners of stock depastured under the *Pasturage and Enclosures Act 1949*, to muster the stock for drenching and inspection by the Stock Inspector at one of the following places between 7 am and 3 pm on any of the dates indicated below for that area. Any variation of dates will be notified over the local radio.

It should be noted that owners of stock to which this direction applies are required to attend either in person or by their appointed agent, at the appropriate muster place to assist the Stock Inspector.

It should be further noted that an approved right of pasturage must exist in respect of calves over the age of 6 months, which are expected to be depastured on common land.

PUBLIC MONEYS ACT 1979
ROADS FUND

I, Ronald Coane Nobbs, Minister for Finance, acting under section 11A of the *Public Moneys Act 1979*, make the following orders —

1. The service provided by the Administration in the construction and maintenance of Roads is a service to which section 11A applies;
2. The service provided by the Administration for and in connection with —
 - (a) the registration of motor vehicles;
 - (b) the collection of fines for breach of the *Road Traffic Act 1982* and Regulations; and
 - (c) the collection of the fuel levy under the *Fuel Levy Act 1987*—
is a service to which section 11A applies;
3. There is hereby created a head of the Administrative Services Fund to be known as the “Roads Fund”;
4. There shall be credited to the Roads Fund all moneys received by the Administration for and in connection with the provision of a service described in paragraph 2;
5. There shall be debited to the Roads Fund all moneys paid by the Administration in or in connection with the provision of the service of the construction and maintenance of roads and the collection of revenue from and in connection with the registration of motor vehicles.

Nothing in this order authorises the expenditure of any money from the Roads Fund that has not been authorised by an appropriation law to be expended for such purpose.

This order has effect from 1 July 2005

CHARGES FOR MUSTERING STOCK

When an owner of stock fail to arrange for his stock to be mustered in accordance with the direction dated 17 March 2005, issued by the Minister for Environment and it is necessary for the work to be carried out by the Administration workers, the Administration will exercise its powers under section 9A(1) of the *Stock Diseases Act 1936*, and charge the owner the cost of such work.

DISPOSAL OF WASTE IN PUBLIC RUBBISH BINS

Rubbish bins are provided in public areas, particularly through the Burnt Pine shopping area, the Bicentennial Centre and at picnic areas in public reserves so people can conveniently dispose of waste that is generated by their picnicking or shopping.

Depositing commercial or domestic wastes in public rubbish bins significantly increases the Administration’s rubbish disposal costs and can also leave little or no room for genuine picnicking or shopping rubbish.

Thank you to the majority of people who “do the right thing” with their waste. It is not much of an effort to take your sorted rubbish to the Waste Management Centre, where we can deal with it efficiently.

Disposing of commercial or domestic waste in a rubbish bin in a public place is an offence under the *Waste Management Act 2003* (maximum fine \$2,000).

This Development Application, the Planning Report and the Instrument of Approval may be inspected, free of charge, during business hours at the Planning Office at the Administration of Norfolk Island, No 11 Quality Row, Kingston.

REVIEWABLE DECISIONS

A decision to approve/refuse the above development application(s) subject to conditions, is a reviewable decision within the meaning of subsection 78(1) of the *Planning Act 2002*.

The applicant and any person who made a written public submission in relation to one of the above proposals has the right to apply to the Administrative Review Tribunal for review of the decision in relation to that proposal.

An application for a review must be lodged within 28 days of the date the approval was given. An application for review must:

- be made in writing;
- be in the approved form;
- identify the decision to be reviewed; and
- state the reasons for the application.

Where a person has been appointed under section 91 of the *Planning Act 2002* to enquire into and make recommendations on matters relevant to the decision makes a recommendation, the decision is a reviewable decision only to the extent the decision does not conform with the recommendation.
